MEMORANDUM FOR THE ASSISTANT COMMANDANT OF THE MARINE CORPS

SUBJECT: Determination of FY 2014 USMC Excepted Activities

- Reference: (a) ACMC Memorandum of 01 Oct 13, "Determination of FY 2014 USMC Excepted Activities"
(b) DepSecDef Memorandum of 25 Sep 13, "Guidance for Continuation of Operations in the Absence of Available Appropriations"


I have reviewed reference (a) for consistency with the guidance for the continuation of operations in the absence of available appropriations as promulgated by the Deputy Secretary of Defense in reference (b). The Department of the Navy will continue to prosecute the war in Afghanistan, including the preparation of forces for deployment; conduct operations necessary for the safety of human life and property; and sustain operations essential for the security of our nation.

To ensure continuity of essential operations, I have approved the execution of all of the activities you identified in reference (a) through at least 4 October with three exceptions that were deferred for consideration because they are scheduled for November or beyond (see Table 1 below). The continuation of seven operations/activities beyond 4 October will require a new request with additional information on implications for TDY, contracts, recall of non-excepted personnel, and other obligations. For these cases, obligations extending beyond 4 October are not approved at this time. New guidance on the waiver-approval process along with a waiver-request template will be forthcoming.

The Operations Chiefs are the unit's senior enlisted proponents of standardization and, as such, assist the commander in the preparation of the unit for combat, tactical planning, and command and control of operations. The Operations Chiefs assist their Operations Officers and commanders with the identification of unit-specific training requirements and deficiencies as a result of evolving operational and threat environments.

This course provides deploying units a venue to train in the tactical aspects of mountain and cold weather operations and conduct tactical integration of MAGTF elements at the battalion level and below. MTNEX is conducted at the Marine Corps Mountain Warfare Training Center, Hawthorne Army Depot, and Naval Air Station Fallon in a distributed manner with participating units sourced and synchronized at the Service level. Any delay in training will hinder the unit's ability to complete PTP prior to deployment.

Graduates of IMLOC 4-13 are assigned to units preparing to deploy to the CentCom theater or ISO MEUs, SPMAGTFs, etc. The Operations Officers and Operations Chiefs of the LCE (Combat Logistics Battalions, Combat Logistics Regiments, and Marine Logistics Groups) must be certified as an ELI prior to being assigned to their designated billet. The ELIs are the unit's proponents of standardization and, as such, assist the commander in the preparation of the unit for combat, tactical planning, and command and control of operations. The ELIs assist their commanders and staff principals with the identification of unit-specific training requirements and deficiencies as a result of evolving operational and threat environments.

Courses at the ATG provide pre-deployment training and assessment, including a fully immersive mission rehearsal exercise to partner-mentor teams deploying to Operation Enduring Freedom. The immersive environment in ATG places students in advisor situations supported by role players, which improves students' rapport building, combined operations planning, mounted and dismounted tactical operations, counter-insurgency, site exploitation, detainee handling, and assessment of Afghanistan National Security Forces. ATG 1-14 is aligned with scheduled deployments, delay or cancellation of this course will interrupt critical training requirements for Transition Teams preparing to deploy to OEF.
